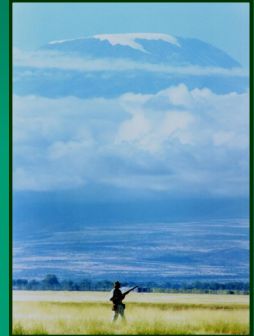
**Shooting Season: 1st July to 31st October 2010 & 1st Feb to 31st March 2011.**



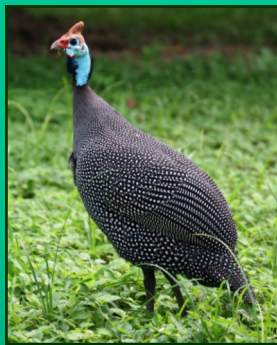
"The private camp is setup for individual groups in advance". We use large (walk in style) canvas sleeping tents, completely waterproof and insect proof. The tents are carpeted and inside are framed beds, chairs and tables. Behind each double tent are ensuite toilet and shower tents - hot showers are available at anytime. Dining involves three course meals prepared over wood coals by an excellent chef of many years service. Meals are served at linen covered tables with china and stemware. Bottled butane gas, rather than a noisy generator is the main source of power for fridges and lighting. Laundry is done daily in camp.



Days are spent bird shooting in the acacia savannah country close to and around Amboseli National Park. The park is an area of swamps and marshes at the foot of Mt Kilimanjaro. The heat of the day attracts large herds of elephant, buffalo, zebra, and gazelle. Transport is by comfortable four wheel drives.



The Masai people living in the area whom over the years we have got to know well are experts at rounding up flocks for driven guinea fowl. Each shooter has a Masai guide to help with carrying shells, dead birds and generally showing the way. They are friendly and welcoming people. Their traditional culture is strong and this provides an interesting additional attraction. We shoot guinea fowl, crested francolin, doves and sand grouse (dependent on local weather conditions). Some birds are driven, other times we do walk ups, otherwise for doves and sand grouse we have stands at local watering points.



**Includes:** Full board food and accommodation (sharing twins) beer, wine and soft drinks, transfers from Nairobi and back and around the shooting area, shooting and camping fees, hunting licenses, shotgun hire and beaters.  
**Excludes:** Alcoholic spirits, ammo costs (\$40 per box), Amboseli Park viewing fees \$60 per person (if necessary).
